| Title | Let's Play Community Construction Grants |

| Description | Keurig, Dr. Pepper & KaBOOM! have teamed up to offer \$15,000 grants to be used toward the purchase of playground equipment. Funds can be used towards the total cost of playground equipment and assembling the playground using the KaBOOM! community-build model. |
| Eligibility | Municipalities, schools, and child-serving nonprofit organizations without a playground or with existing equipment that is unsafe for children are eligible for this opportunity. |
| Amount | \$15,000 |

| Description | Game On grants for BE Time provide funding for schools to implement school/student/family-led physical activity and nutrition programs that provide more options for unstructured time at school to support the whole child. "BE Time" is unstructured time spent without screens for kids to play and explore their imaginations to nourish their minds, creativity, bodies and relationships. |
| Eligibility | K-12 schools in the following states are eligible to apply: AR, AZ, CA, CO, FL, GA, IL, IN, KY, MD, MN, NC, NY, OH, PA, TN, TX, VA, WI. Schools with 75% or more of students eligible for free/reduced-priced meals may receive priority.. |
| Amount | \$5,000-\$10,000 |

| Eligibility | 501c designated organizations (recognized and in good standing with the IRS for a minimum of one year) and tax-exempt public service agencies in the U.S. that are using the power of volunteers to improve the community. |
| Amount | Up to \$5,000 in the form of a Home Depot gift card to purchase tools, materials, or services that are required to be completed within 6 months of approval date. |
