ABOUT EL CENTRO DE CORAZÓN

Founded in 1994, El Centro de Corazón (El Centro) is an accomplished Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) with three health center locations in Houston's East End, offering a comprehensive range of adult and pediatric health care services for the underserved, which includes primary care and family medicine, women's health, dental, and behavioral health services. El Centro also provides ancillary services to assist patients to overcome barriers to accessing health care. In 2023, El Centro provided direct patient care to 12,339 lowincome children and adults for a total of 47,347 patient visits.

LETTER FROM MARCIE MIR, LCSW

It is my joy and privilege to present El Centro de Corazón's (El Centro) 2023 Impact Report that highlights our commitment to strengthen our communities as shown by our donors, supporters, and volunteer board members, but most especially by our incredible staff. Whether they are healthcare providers, clinical support staff, or management staff, El Centro's employees are genuinely the most caring and dedicated people I have had the honor to lead and work beside as El Centro's Chief Executive Officer. Working in community health can be challenging at times; but it is also very rewarding. All these individuals work tirelessly to ensure this organization grows stronger and is better able to meet the needs of those we serve. As a result of these tireless efforts, I can report that El Centro was able to serve 12,339 patients in 47,347 visits in 2023.

As a community health center, El Centro is focused on providing whole-person healthcare, including comprehensive primary care, dental, and behavioral health services for children and adults in need in Houston's East End community. However, we must provide much more than that. Whole-person care means that we focus on those non-medical factors that impact health like food insecurity, housing, and transportation. El Centro's Community Health Workers are now part of the clinical care team to assist our patients with maximizing mainstream and community resources that address these factors. For example, I recall one of our families who lost their home to a fire and were struggling to survive; our CHWs immediately connected them to community resources for clothes, food, school supplies, and furniture. By leveraging our community partnerships, our CHWs guide patients to specialty care providers, substance use disorder treatment services, healthy food service providers, and school supplies/ backpacks during our Back-to-School expo every August.

Meeting our community's needs is what we do. When patients from the Guatemalan community in the East End who are not Spanish speaking are coming to El Centro for healthcare and other services, we engage a company to provide translation services in two of the main dialects spoken. As a result, our reputation has even spread to our patients' families and friends who reside in Guatemala. I know that we have a strong reputation here in Houston and I remember realizing that we are internationally renowned! Indeed, our patients are finding us through word of mouth because of the excellence of the services we provide to everyone who comes into any of our health centers.

The philosopher Aristotle wrote that excellence is never an accident; it is the result of high intention, sincere effort, and intellectual execution. Our staff, Board members, and community partners strive for this every day. Our patients and community who face so many obstacles in life, deserve nothing less.

El Centro's vision is to be the cornerstone of a healthier community. We are truly invested in the communities we serve. Every day we work to achieve our vision: building a healthier community – making sure that our patients are physically, mentally, academically, financially, and spiritually healthy. It is the foundation that El Centro was built upon, and it continues to be our driving force.





In 2023, around **69.7% of our patients identified as female**, and 30.3% identified as male.



Patient Income as % of Poverty Level





OUR SERVICES

El Centro is building a healthier community in Houston's East End by improving prevention and intervention through high quality, comprehensive health care services.

ADULT PRIMARY CARE • Comprehensive medical care services address prevention, assessment, diagnosis, screening, and treatment of acute and chronic conditions . Referrals and follow-up of such services, documenting the referral loop is closed . Wellexams • Sick visits • Immunizations • Cervical cancer and colorectal cancer screenings . Chronic disease management including diabetes, high blood pressure, heart disease, and asthma • Healthy lifestyle education

PEDIATRIC PRIMARY CARE • Well-exams • School/sports physical exams • Sick visits • Immunizations • Newborn screenings • Hearing and vision screenings • Chronic disease management

ADULT & PEDIATRIC DENTAL SERVICES • All basic dental screenings and recommendations for preventive intervention . Oral hygiene instruction and related oral health education . Oral prophylaxis, as necessary • Topical application of fluorides (e.g., fluoride Application varnishes) of sealants Diagnostic screening for caries and periodontal disease • Dental x-rays • Each patient also receives a dental care bag at each visit

WOMEN'S HEALTH SERVICES • Clinical assessment, management, treatment, and coordination of services and referrals to care for people planning pregnancy, during their pregnancy, during labor and delivery, and after they give birth. • Gynecological services including Annual Well-Woman exams • Ultrasounds • Testing for sexually transmitted infections • Pregnancy testing • Family planning • Premenstrual syndrome and menopause screenings. • Referrals are available for services not performed at El Centro health centers.

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES • Address behavioral issues (mental health and substance used disorders (SUDs)) in primary, pediatric, and women's health care by providing brief interventions and pathway services (one-onone, screenings, and group visits) • 24-hour crisis intervention for patients in need of immediate behavior health services • Screen patients ages 12 years and older for depression referring patients with positive screenings for BHS services . Virtual support groups and psychoeducation groups for children • Brief intervention, psychoeducation, and referral to community services for those with behavioral health diagnosis for SUDs. • Provided School-Based services at local elementary. middle, and high schools.

ELIGIBILITY SERVICES • Prior to a patient's first appointment at El Centro, our friendly and bilingual eligibility staff work with each patient to assess their unique needs and explore which programs would best support those needs.



COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT & CHW PROGRAM

Through its innovative Community Health Worker Program, El Centro realizes its vision to be the cornerstone of a healthier community by extending its care beyond its physical clinics to address social determinants of health barriers experienced by East End residents. Consisting of an Outreach team and Clinic-based team, both employ certified **Community Health Workers (CHWs).** The outreach team encounters people in the community through community events, venues and social media efforts and connects people with needed health and social services in their communities. If the client does not have a health home and chooses El Centro, the Outreach CHW assists with the client's entry into the heath center.

The Clinic-based team helps El Centro's patients navigate mainstream and community support services to maximize needed resources. This team also addresses nonmedical drivers of health such as providing bus passes to reduce transportation barriers, making appointments on behalf of patients to outside entities for those patients who cannot self-navigate, and offering translation services for Limited English Proficiency patients so that they can communicate in their preferred language. Both teams can help patients and community members with food insecurity issues access healthy, nutritious food as well as meal-planning and shopping education and guidance.



El Centro recognized its Community Health Workers with a special lunch to celebrate CHW Day and for their dedication to serving our patients and providing outreach, community education, and social support for children, adults, and families in Houston's East End.

Our Work:

- Connect patients with a referral database to appropriate resources (e.g., Social Services Resource Locators such as "211info" or "Unite Us")
- Gives patients written resources information based on a health center-maintained resources list, "My Chart"
- Provides more personalized navigation support to patients to connect directly with community resources
- Food insecurity screenings

PROGRAMS INITIATIVES

In addition to our comprehensive health care services, we also have a wide range of programs that our patients can enroll in or can be enrolled in with the recommendation of their physician.

CHILDREN'S WELLNESS PROGRAM/NUTRICIÓN CON CORAZÓN

Designed to address the prevalence of childhood obesity in our service area using a comprehensive approach, the program includes medical assessments, individualized treatment plans, one-on-one education classes, weight management structure, cooking classes and/or local food shopping trips, and referrals for behavioral health services.



CONSERVANDO CORAZÓNES

A hypertension control initiative, to improve the health outcomes of adult patients with high blood pressure, participants are provided self-monitoring blood pressure units to increase their awareness of hypertension and how to control it through preventive care.

COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKER PROGRAM

El Centro expanded its Community Health Worker Program by linking individuals and families to needed services and mainstream and community resources.
